

'William Empson as Critic-Philosopher'

ABSTRACT: William Empson is known chiefly - in so far as he is nowadays known at all - as the precocious author of the brilliantly subtle and perceptive (some would say waywardly inventive) 1930 book *Seven Types of Ambiguity*. My talk will make the case that philosophers of language have much to learn from Empson's close-focused analyses of poetry and his reflections on the role of ambiguity, paradox and contradiction in poetic and other kinds of utterance. I shall also suggest - in the main part of my talk - that in his later book, *The Structure of Complex Words* (1951), he went on to explore these issues in greater depth and with more pointed relevance to debates in philosophical semantics and philosophy of logic.
