
Award – winning author of *The Disappeared* 2009 Scotiabank Giller Prize nominee



A world-renown author, Kim Echlin lives in Toronto where she teaches at the University of Toronto and works as a freelance writer of film/television documentary. Her novel, *The Disappeared* (2009, was the winner of the 2011 Barnes and Noble Discovery award, long listed for the Dublin IMPAC award, and 2009 nominee for The Scotiabank Giller Prize, and was translated and released in 16 foreign territories. She is also the author of two other novels, *Elephant Winter* (1997) that received the Torgi Award and was a nominee for the Chapters/Books in Canada First Novel Award and the National Magazine Award for travel writing, and *Dagmar's Daughter* (2001). Her dissertation toward her doctoral degree (York University) focuses on Ojibway oral storytelling. Echlin also won the CBC Literary Prize for Creative Non-Fiction for her essay "I, Witness" (2006).
